Fourth Sunday of Advent December 19, 9am

Cradle and cross are inextricably connected on the fourth Sunday of Advent. Between a lovely tribute to the little town of Bethlehem and Mary's magnificent song of praise, the letter to the Hebrews reminds us in no uncertain terms that Christ's

advent is for "the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." It is the kind of tension in which the church always lives as when in holy communion—with high delight—"we proclaim the Lord's death."

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

Word

FIRST READING

Micah 5:2-5a

The book of Micah was written when Jerusalem was surrounded by an invading army. While the situation was bleak, Micah reminds the people of the promise made to David (whose home town was Bethlehem): his dynasty would not fail, and God would provide a righteous king and peace.

²But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days. ³Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has brought forth; then the rest of his kindred shall return to the people of Israel. ⁴And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God. And they shall live secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth; ^{5a}and he shall be the one of peace.

The word of the Lord, **Thanks be to God.**

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

The Advent Wreath helps us mark the time until Christmas Eve. Each week, an additional candle is lit. We sing Wait for the Lord one time, then after the prayer is read, we sing the verse a second time as the candles are lit.

Wait for the Lord, whose day is near. Wait for the Lord: be strong, take heart!

Advent 4

We praise you, O God, for this wheel of time that marks our days of preparation for Christ's advent. As we light the candles on this wreath, open our eyes to see your

presence in the lowly ones of this earth. Enlighten us with your grace, that we may sing of your advent among us in the Word made flesh. Grant this through Christ our Lord, whose coming is certain and whose day draws near. **Amen.**

SECOND READING

Hebrews 10:5-10

One of the themes of Hebrews is that Jesus has fulfilled and replaced Israel's Temple and sacrificial system as the meeting-place of God and humans. The "body you have prepared for me" is an appropriate reference to the Gospel reading's description of Christ's coming in the flesh.

⁵Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; ⁶in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. ⁷Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)." ⁸When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), ⁹then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

*GOSPEL READING

Luke 1:39-55

While she and her husband are aged, Elizabeth has miraculously become pregnant with the child who will become John the Baptist. In the meantime, in Nazareth, her cousin Mary has received a visit from the angel Gabriel, who offers her the opportunity to become the mother of Jesus. Mary travels to Jerusalem to meet Elizabeth.

The holy gospel according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

³⁹In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, ⁴⁰where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit ⁴²and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. ⁴³And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? ⁴⁴For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."

⁴⁶And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, ⁴⁷and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, ⁴⁸for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; ⁴⁹for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. ⁵⁰His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. ⁵¹He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. ⁵²He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; ⁵³he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. ⁵⁴He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, ⁵⁵according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever."

***NICENE CREED**
